I. Welcome and Attendance

- The Meeting began at 6:02 p.m. President Lopez welcomed all the family members on behalf of the Migrant Parent Advisory Committee and presented all officers and guests.

II. Adoption of the Agenda

- President Lopez presented the agenda and approval of the agenda was motioned by Mr. Miguel Ruix and seconded by Alicia Velasco.

III. Training activity/Program Goals for Migrant Students:

- Ms. Ivonne Glenn introduced all Migrant Personnel, their duties, and how they assist to better the Migrant Program.
- Ms. Glenn presented Yvonne Alvarez the Teacher on Special Assignment that will be working with students in an after school program twice a week at P.A. Walsh and El Toro Elementary Schools. Ms. Alvarez introduced herself and

talked about the projects for this year, such as the Saturday Academy for students in grades third through fifth.

IV. Training Activity/ Qualification: Review of activity programs:

- Ms. Glenn presented a powerpoint report on Summer School. She explained the services that were offered during summer school, student academic growth.
 - i. A parent asked if 5 weeks for summer school was too long?
 - ii. A parent asked why the 1st and 2nd grade did not have academic growth.
 - iii. Ms. Glenn explained that it could be because they were in a combination class
 - iv. A parent wondered how often the vision screenings occur. Ms. Glenn explained that parents can take their child to the migrant office and Teresa Romero can do the vision screening.
 - v. Among the summer services, Adriana Magallon explained the OSY program, its purpose, how many spaces were offered, and how many students participated. She also shared about the students in Grade 9-10 who attended the CAMP at Fresno State University; the experience in the dorms and its rules. Brian Campos, one of the students that attended the CAMP program gave a testimony about some of his experiences and the parents asked him a few questions.
 - vi. Adrianna also explained other program services such as students were offered a computer with accessories for attending a Saturday class in San Jose.

V. Training Activity/ Qualification: personnel of the program: Nominations and Elections:

- It was mentioned that the position of the president and secretary were vacant as the officers' eligibility ended; Only Jose wanted to continue as President as a member of the community.
- A motion was made, Alicia nominated Jose and the nomination was seconded by Emilia Rojas. The nomination was taken to a vote and the vote was unanimous.
- Nominations for Secretary were made. The nominees were Alicia Velasco and Leonor Perez. The ballots were passed, picked and counted. Alicia won the position by a majority of 13 votes to 9 votes for Leonor Perez.
- Jose Lopez presented the new MPAC secretary, Alicia Velasco and mentioned she had two girls attending P.A. Walsh.

VI. Other Topics or Presentations: or invitees

- Dr. Zavala introduced himself and explained his position within the district. He explained about our schools and each one's specialty.
- Dr. Zavala shared how to prepare our children for the university and the different scholarships available to students and he announced that there is a CABE Conference in Monterey on October 20th.
- Teresa Murillo was introduced and greeted the audience briefly.
- Francisco Perez passed out flyers regarding the benefits of the Migrant Program.
