

Security of Buildings and Grounds

Buildings constitute one of the greatest investments of the school district. It is in the best interest of pupils and taxpayers to protect that investment adequately.

Appropriate security includes:

1. Adequate locks and security of keys.
2. Minimizing fire and other hazards.
3. Reducing the probability of equipment failure.
4. Keeping records and funds in a safe place.
5. Protection against vandalism and burglary.

The Superintendent is directed to establish such rules and regulations as may be needed to provide for security as outlined above.
